Keeping Tabs on What's Coming (or Not Coming) Down the Pipes

The U.S. has just been ranked among nine other nations facing "critical water shortages" as reported by *Contractor Magazine*.¹ According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, nearly half of the country is facing abnormally dry conditions to critically severe conditions. California has been declared a state of emergency due to record breaking droughts and several of the plains states are facing dust bowl condi-

tions. To make matters worse, even as Mother Nature dries up, because of our country's aging infrastructure leaks alone waste nearly 1.7 trillion gallons of water per year, estimated to be equal to 16% of our nation's treated water. To add to the problem, the American Society of Civil Engineers estimates that there are 240,000 water main breaks per year contributing to this loss of increasingly-scarce, clean water.

So why are we, a group of plumbing manufacturers, concerning ourselves with droughts and infrastructure? It's because cities, counties, and states facing these severe water shortages are being forced to conserve water and increase the efficiency of its use in any way they can. For many areas, tearing up streets and easements to replace existing water infrastructure is just not a fiscal reality, nor is importing water to parched areas. That leaves finding ways to ease the strain on aging systems and making the most efficient use of the water available. Conservative estimates indicate that three billion gallons of water per day can be saved simply by retrofitting plumbing fixtures to WaterSense products, which are already on the market, and offer an immediate, low-cost, effective and painless solution. These products work! To qualify for the WaterSense label, today's products must pass rigorous performance standards that far exceed their water-guzzling predecessors.

For the purpose of universal and consistent language, PMI actively engages with local and state jurisdictions that are

looking to pass new laws and regulations to address these water shortages. Last month, the Governor of Colorado signed into law (Senate Bill 14-103) the "Phase in High-Efficiency Water Fixture Options" which addresses the state's water shortages by promoting the sale of WaterSense products (see story on page 3). In view of similar PMI-backed legislation and successes in California and Texas, PMI was contacted by and worked closely with Denver Water to craft the legislation. We will continue to work with them to enhance the law during the state's next legislative session. PMI has also identified several additional states facing critical water shortages and is working to raise awareness of the issue with policymakers in those areas, including: Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Nevada, Oklahoma, Texas, Utah and the District of Columbia. Beyond just legislation, PMI advocates retrofitting legacy products to high efficiency WaterSense products through rebate programs and other incentives.

Additionally, PMI sent letters to each U.S. Senator urging them to support the "WaterSense Efficiency, Conservation, and Adaption Act of 2014" (S. 2226) recently introduced to the Senate by **Senator Tom Udall** (D-NM) that would help create funding for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) run program. In May, our CEO, **Barbara C. Higgens**, was invited to participate on an international panel to provide details of the U.S. EPA's voluntary and consumerchoice based Water Sense program and PMI's s involvement in the U.S. (see story on page 3) as the European Union also struggles to address water shortages of their own.

Driving change, building awareness and keeping tabs on the latest changes, and developing situations, is a big job for PMI's staff. PMI is dedicated to the cause, and equally dedicated to spreading the word. Follow us on our social media sites and download the free PMI mobile app to get the most up-to-date developments. New Report: Switching Out Inefficient Toilets to WaterSense Models Saves 7.3 Gallons of Water Per Person Per Day

Drought-plagued California could stretch its available water supply as much as 30 percent by making more effective use of existing resources, according to a new analysis released by the Pacific Institute and the Natural Resources Defense Council in June, 2014. The water would be found by expanding use of such existing strategies as conservation, water recycling, rainwater capture, and more efficient agricultural irrigation techniques. As part of water conservation, the report, The Untapped Potential of California's Water Supply, highlights the water saving benefits of simply upgrading old plumbing fixtures to WaterSense products. For instance, by switching out an old, inefficient toilet and installing a 1.28-gallon-per-flush WaterSense model, a consumer would save 7.3 gallons per person per day. Multiplying this by the average population over the study period (36 million people) gives a potential savings of 260 million gallons per day, or 0.29 million acre-feet per year. The report provides similar calculations for faucets and showerheads.

Higgens Talks WaterSense on European CEIR Panel

PMI CEO Barbara C. Higgens was featured on a panel as part of the 2014 annual conference of CEIR, the European Association for the Taps and Valves Industry held in Interlocken, Switzerland. She was invited by the group to provide background and impact of the US Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Water Sense labelling program. Two similar schemes are currently under consideration and debate in the European Union. Also participating on the panel were representatives from the European Union Commission, the Swiss Federal Office of Energy, the sanitary ware industry, the taps and valves industry, Yvonne Orgill, CEO of the Bathroom Manufacturers Association (BMA) and CEIR president Klaus Schneider of Laufen.

Through Barbara, PMI has participated in CEIR, the European Valve Association, since 1999. The affiliation has opened up communication channels and built strong relationships with allied associations and manufacturers around the world. PMI has shared its message with

and attracted new international members through this important global network. Topics like the regulation of lead and nickel were first raised here during this international conference.

In addition to the lively discussion about a proposed European water label, the 2014 CEIR conference also focused on counterfeit products, microbial contamination of drinking water and the comparison/contrast of "green" building certifications around the world by NEOPERL's **Jörg Rudolph**. Mr. Rudolph has been invited to reprise his presentation at the PMI Fall 2014 Conference.

President Obama Signs Water Infrastructure Legislation

On June 10, 2014, **President Obama** signed into law the "Water Resources and Reform Development Act", a measure intended to help lower the cost of repairing the nation's aging water and wastewater infrastructure. This is the first major water infrastructure measure that has passed Congress since 2007.

The measure establishes a five-year pilot program – the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Authority (WIFIA). WIFIA will provide communities with low-interest federal loans for their large water and wastewater infrastructure projects. WIFIA is modeled after the Department of Transportation's Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act, a successful federal program which has supported major public-private partnership transportation projects. Colorado Governor Signs Bill Phasing in Sale of WaterSense Plumbing Fixtures

On June 6, the Governor of Colorado, **John Hickenlooper**, signed the "Phase in High-Efficiency Water Fixture Options" (Senate Bill 14-103) into law. The measure seeks to improve water efficiency in the state by reducing flow rates and flush volumes. It will require the sale of plumbing fixtures meeting WaterSense standards for lavatory faucets, toilets, urinals and showerheads. The law does not mandate that residents change their existing plumbing products. The WaterSense plumbing fixtures efficiency standards for Colorado are set to go into effect in September 2016.

PMI actively worked on securing passage of SB 14-103 with Denver Water and a variety of water groups on this measure. PMI plans to work with Denver Water to enhance the law during the next legislative session in 2015. Currently, Georgia, Texas, and California are the only states that require the sale of high-efficiency, performance-tested fixtures. The law is expected to help address the Colorado Water Conservation Board's predictions of water supplies running short by 500,000 acre-feet of water per year in 2050 if habits don't change.
