The Four-Way Test and Plumbing Manufacturers International

I've been involved with Rotary Club International for a number of years, following in the footsteps of my late dad who had decades of perfect attendance in the organization and served as the president of the Dunedin, Florida chapter. As he worked and vacationed, he visited Rotary Clubs throughout the USA and around the world. Several years ago, I brought him to a Palatine, Illinois Rotary meeting as part of the "show and tell" segment. Folks were awed! While times have changed, (women are now accepted as full-fledged members and missed meetings can be made up online), Rotary's focus remains constant, reflecting the motto: "Service Above Self." Founded in 1905, the club now boasts more than 34,000 clubs and over 1.2 million members worldwide.

There is a strong connection between Rotary and PMI. That connection appeals to me on a number of levels. For example, the founder was a Chicago attorney who worked as a plumber (among other things). In addition to working to eradicate polio, another of the goals of the organization is to pro-

vide clean water around the world. This fits neatly with the work we do at PMI. And with an unofficial credo of "having fun and doing good," the group works hard to support and serve the local community in which PMI is based.

Another important parallel is that Rotary's Four-Way test includes principals which also guide PMI. We reference these guidelines as we build consensus, reach out to legislators as a resource and establish position papers. We work hard to represent the interest of our members and the industry fairly and honestly – no hyperbole or hysteria here – just the straight story. Maintaining our credibility is essential to being trusted and relied upon as we move forward. Like PMI, Rotary is a proponent of the value of networking.

Unlike Rotary, PMI does not purport to represent the world in its initiatives. I've learned that there has been some confusion expressed by members about the "International" part of PMI's name which was changed from "Institute" in 2010. As I said at the General Membership Meeting during the recent Fall Conference, the intent is not that PMI function as the global association representing manufacturers around the world. PMI's mission is not to compete with our counterparts including the UK-based Bathroom Manufacturers Association (BMA) and Canadian Institute of Plumbing and Heating (CIPH), but rather to work with them. PMI includes in its "early warning" knowledge exchange and reporting, those issues around the world that are likely to impact the USA. Our counterparts provide a heads up to emerging issues and PMI does the same for them. Lead and nickel product content are examples of issues that arose in the UK and USA and which BMA and PMI communicated to their respective membership bodies well in advance of issues reaching our respective shores.

As we close the books on another PMI year, I'm pleased that PMI continues to hold fast to its core principles as we build consensus and pursue our mission. It's not always easy to address the various requests and wishes of our diverse PMI membership. It's not always easy to keep everybody happy. (Just take a look at the sometimes conflicting responses to the satisfaction surveys we send frequently to PMI members.) BUT that's our goal. Many trade associations are fraught with political turmoil and turnover; I was told when I joined PMI in 1998 that the average tenure of a CEO/Executive Director was about three years. The political pitfalls are many and sometimes subtle.

PMI members have been loyal and supportive of the organization and its initiatives. Thank you for that. We clearly would not exist without the support of our members both in terms of dues investment you make each year, and the work you do on our various projects and committees. We can't spell PMI without you! (Because if we did it would read funny: Pl*mbing Man*fact*rers International.)

CEOs See Resurgence of U.S. Plumbing Manufacturing

Six CEOs from Plumbing Manufacturers International (PMI) member companies presented a consensus view of a resurging U.S. plumbing manufacturing industry responding to consumer and environmental needs through product innovation at the recent PMI Fall Conference.

Speaking as part of the Executive Panel Discussion moderated by journalist and media personality **Bill Kurtis**, the CEOs agreed that aftershocks from the home equity and lending downturn are still resulting in consumer caution. However, they expressed optimism that innovative plumbing products resulting in water savings and sustainability will increasingly capture the interest of those considering remodeling projects.

Droughts occurring primarily in southwestern states such as California and Texas are sensitizing consumers to the importance of water savings and sustainability. The challenge for the plumbing industry is to help consumers and policymakers connect the dots between water savings and innovative plumbing products.




PMI Mourns the Loss of a Friend
